The Marine Corps policy for safety is governed by MCO 5100.29B (Safety Program) and MCO 3500.27B (Operational Risk Management Program)

Mission: Commands at all levels shall establish and maintain a vibrant and viable safety program where maintaining combat readiness, eliminating preventable mishaps, and preserving our most precious assets – our Marines and Sailors, civilian personnel and equipment - is every Marine's goal and responsibility.




Regardless of MOS, our role as United States Marines comes with inherent risks. Safety programs and Risk Management are designed to mitigate those risks and ultimately reduce the chances of a mishap. Whether in the air, on the ground, at work, or on liberty, I believe we can eliminate preventable mishaps.

The Executive Officer is responsible for the execution of the squadron's safety program. However, I challenge each of you to support the XO through continual risk assessment and mitigation. Per the governing orders, you each have the duty to notify the command of any unsafe or unhealthful operation or working condition.

ANYMOUSE Program: The ANYMOUSE Program is designed for anyone who has a safety or health related concern to be able to anonymously come forward and have that concern addressed. Subject matter may include both safety or health related concerns and suggestions, or hazard reporting. Anyone may anonymously submit a concern using the ANYMOUSE box located in the entryway stairwell.

Our goal is to establish and maintain a safety culture throughout this unit that preserves all resources through risk mitigation, reinforces on- and off-duty behavior, and results in an enhanced state of combat readiness.
